FINANCIAL SYSTEM

Febraban Banking Economy Newsletter

According to the Brazilian Federation of Banks (Febraban), market participants in the financial sector are keeping a close eye on the banking crisis that is already causing concerns for major players like Deutsche Bank. The crisis involving the German bank began on March 24th after the institution announced that it would redeem a level 2 subordinate bond early. Due to the current level of risk aversion in the markets, market participants interpreted the move in a negative way, which caused Deutsche Bank's shares to fall 15.0% on the day. Despite this setback, it was recently announced that the bank First Citizens will acquire the loans and deposits of SVB. This acquisition is expected to bring stability to the banking sector, and it is being received positively by the market.

Brazil Central Bank (BCB) releases guidelines for the Real Digital pilot project

On March 8th, the Central Bank of Brazil (BCB) released the guidelines for the Real Digital pilot project and announced that starting in March, it will begin testing a platform for Digital Real operations, the "RD Pilot", in alignment with the new guidelines.

Among the updated guidelines for the Digital Real, the following are highlighted: (i) emphasis on the development of innovative models using technologies such as smart contracts and programmable money; (ii) focus on the development of online applications; (iii) issuance of the Digital Real by the BCB as a means of payment through deposit tokens; (iv) guarantee of legal security and privacy in operations; (v) adoption of technology solutions based on Distributed Ledger Technology - DLT for asset registration; (vi) interoperability and integration with systems from other jurisdictions, in addition to the adoption of resilience and cybersecurity standards equivalent to those applicable to critical financial market infrastructures.

CVM releases Regulatory Result Evaluation agenda for 2023-2026

On February 27th, Brazilian Securities and Exchange Commission - CVM released its Regulatory Result Evaluation (ARR) agenda for 2023-2026. Regulations rules involving corporate governance reporting, reference forms, and public offerings were selected for the evaluation impact analysis.

FINANCIAL SYSTEM

BCB and credit bureaus sign agreement for information sharing

On March 20th, the Central Bank of Brazil (BCB) and five credit bureau managers signed a technical cooperation agreement (ACT) to access information from the Credit Information System (SCR) about credit operations, either paid or in progress, for individuals or companies registered in the system's databases, in accordance with the terms of the Positive Registry Laws (Law No. 12,414 of 2011) and the Bank Secrecy Law (Complementary Law No. 105 of 2001).

CVM postpones Resolution CVM 181 implementation date

The Brazilian Securities and Exchange Commission (CVM) approved on March 28th Resolution CVM 181, which makes specific changes to Resolution CVM 175, the new regulatory framework for investment funds. The main change was the postponement of the implementation date to October 2, 2023, in response to requests made by market representatives.

CVM issues Resolution for changes in securities offerings regulations

On March 22nd, the Brazilian Securities and Exchange Commission (CVM) announced the publication of Resolution CVM 180, which brings modifications to Resolutions CVM 80 and CVM 160, both from 2022, to clarify regulatory commands and allow for the application of automatic procedures in subsequent offerings. Resolution CVM 180 includes specific changes to Resolution CVM 160, which deals with public offerings of securities. One of the modifications is the clearer definition of the concept of Frequent Fixed Income Issuer (EFRF), to avoid doubts regarding the possibility of offers benefiting from automatic procedures in cases where the sole debtor of a securitization title qualifies as an EFRF.

Susep releases Monthly Summary with sector data for January

On March 17th, the Superintendence of Private Insurance (Susep) released a report indicating a 19.6% growth in the collection of the insurance sector in January 2023 compared to the same period last year, totaling BRL 31.15 billion. In addition, the sector returned approximately BRL 20 billion in indemnities and redemptions in the same month.

TRANSPORT

National Waterway Transportation Agency (ANTAQ)

ANTAQ e TCU sign a Cooperation Agreement

The National Waterway Transportation Agency (ANTAQ) and the Federal Court of Accounts (TCU) signed, on March 8, 2023, the first Technical Cooperation Agreement (ATC) between the entities for sharing technical-scientific knowledge and training of their resources, including the promotion of joint actions for the design and adoption of new methodologies and solutions of common interest.

ANTAQ authorizes public consultation for the bidding of terminal ITG 02 at the Port of Itaguaí sign a Cooperation Agreement

On March 27th, the Brazilian National Agency of Waterway Transportation (ANTAQ) approved the opening of a public consultation to improve the technical and legal documents for the ITG 02 terminal bidding process at the organized port of Itaguaí (RJ). The expectation is that the new venture, which will be implemented in an area of 348,937m², will receive almost R\$ 3 billion in investments throughout the concession, increasing the capacity to export iron ore through the Itaguaí port and moving almost 400 million tons during the contractual period. This is the first public hearing authorized by ANTAQ in 2023. The preparatory documents for the bidding process were approved at the last Ordinary Board Meeting held.

The Brazilian Waterway Transportation Sector handled over 87.2 million tons in January

According to data from the National Waterway Transportation Agency (ANTAQ), the waterway sector handled over 87.2 million tons in January of this year. The 2.76% decrease compared to the same period in 2022 was driven by the decrease in the movement of iron ore, which moved 23 million tons (a decrease of 11% compared to January of last year).

The highlight was corn, which moved 6.2 million tons, showing a growth of 127.93% when compared to January 2022. Sugar and wheat also had satisfactory performance rates with 1.6 million tons (+32.17%) and 1.2 million tons (an increase of 20.0%), respectively.

Brazilian Federal Supreme Court (STF)

Competence of ANTT - ADI 5,906/DF, Justice Marco Aurélio, virtual judgment concluded on 3/3/2023.

Summary: The exercise of regulatory activity by the National Land Transportation Agency (ANTT) - especially the regulatory provisions that give it the competence to define offenses and impose administrative sanctions and measures applicable to transport services - must respect the limits for its action defined in the delegating legislative act emanating from the National Congress.

National Land Transportation Agency (ANTT)

ANTT regulates tariff readjustments and revisions in road concession contracts

The National Land Transportation Agency (ANTT) published on March 10th the Normative Instruction No. 18/2023, which establishes the rules for tariff readjustments and revisions in highway concession contracts. The measure aims to ensure legal certainty in contracts and transparency in the process of setting fees. For more information, access the [document](#).

ANTT launches the PROREV Program

On March 27, the National Land Transportation Agency (ANTT) announced the launch of the Road Concession Revision Support Program (ProRev), aimed at promoting the improvement of the quality of infrastructure services granted to the private sector. The program will review road concession contracts to adjust contractual conditions to current sector needs and promote modernization of infrastructure. ProRev will be executed in two phases: the first phase is the diagnostic phase, which aims to assess the current situation of road concessions and identify key challenges. The second phase of ProRev is the revision phase, which aims to propose measures for improvements,

ANTT convened Public Hearing No. 4/2023

On March 17, ANTT convened Public Hearing No. 4/2023, which aims to present the draft that establishes the third norm of the Regulation of Road Concessions (RCR 3), applicable to the concession contracts of road infrastructure under ANTT's competence. The initiative aims to update the regulatory framework of federal road concessions, addressing 12 regulatory matters, such as social and capital composition rules of the concessionaire, financing, insurance, tariff and non-tariff revenues, economic-financial management, tariff reviews, and concession accounts, among others. The contribution period will be from 9:00 am on March 27, 2023, to 6:00 pm on May 12, 2023. The virtual public session will take place on April 27, 2023, from 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm.

Rule: "The constitution of public foundations of private law for the provision of public health services is constitutional." Summary: State law can authorize the creation of public foundations of private law to operate in the provision of public health services.

The STF has decided that road transport services can be granted by authorization

The Plenary of the Brazilian Federal Supreme Court (STF) validated, on Wednesday (03/29), rules that permits granting interstate and international collective land passenger transport services through simple authorization, without prior bidding procedure. By majority, the Court understood that, in addition to being constitutional, the current regime that regulates the use of authorization in the sector increases efficiency in providing this essential and relevant service to the well-being of society. The matter was judged in the analysis of Direct Actions of Unconstitutionality (ADIs) 5549 and 6270, presented by the Attorney General's Office (PGR) and the National Association of Interstate Road Passenger Transport Companies (Anatrip), respectively, to question provisions of Law 12.996/2014.



National Civil Aviation Agency (ANAC)

The 2023-2024 Regulatory Agenda is now available

The National Civil Aviation Agency (ANAC) has made available for consultation the Regulatory Agenda for the 2023-2024 biennium. The publication, which contains the priority themes for the agency's activities, aims to guide the development and updating of aviation sector regulations with transparency and society's participation. The Regulatory Agenda is a document that formally indicates the themes that require priority action in ANAC's standardization process, taking into account the impacts generated on society. The participation of society is one of the key points of the Agenda, reinforcing the model of transparency and social participation in constant development in the Agency. The themes planned for the 2023-2024 biennium are listed in a table, which can be accessed in the regulation that established the planning. The schedule for the Regulatory Agenda is in the final stage of preparation and will be disclosed in a regulation subsequently.

With 8.3 million passengers transported, domestic market grows 11% in January

The domestic market of Brazilian civil aviation moved 8.3 million passengers in January 2023. This is the highest number of domestic passengers recorded in the month since 2021. The total represents an 11% growth compared to the total of domestic passengers moved in January 2022 and 93.2% of the domestic demand registered in January 2019, the period that preceded the Covid-19 pandemic.

Committee approves the National Operational Safety Plan for Civil Aviation

The Brazilian Civil Aviation Operational Safety Committee (CSO-BR) approved, on February 27, 2023, the second edition of the National Operational Safety Plan for Civil Aviation (PNSO), in force for the biennium 2023 and 2025. This new version of the Plan defines strategic objectives and specific actions, including for the improvement of civil aviation operational safety, defined from analysis and management of identified risks. The Technical Permanent Working Group of the CSO-BR is responsible for monitoring the Plan's objectives, under the coordination of ANAC.

Superior Court of Justice

Case under judicial secrecy, rapporteur Minister Luis Felipe Salomão, rapporteur for the judgment Minister Marco Buzzi, Fourth Panel, by majority, judged on 09/27/2022, DJe 02/16/2023.

Topic: Health insurance. Unavailability of a service provider accredited within the coverage area. Operator that fails to ensure care within the same municipality, even if by a non-integrated provider. Duty of reimbursement.

Highlight: Health insurance providers have a duty to reimburse medical and hospital expenses incurred by beneficiaries outside of the accredited network in cases where they fail to ensure care within the same municipality, even if by a non-integrated provider.

HEALTH SURVEILLANCE

National Health Surveillance Agency (Anvisa)

ANVISA releases Regulatory Agenda

On March 20th, the National Health Surveillance Agency (ANVISA) made available the Regulatory Projects Monitoring Panel for the 2021-2023 Agenda, with the scheduled timelines for developing the regulatory proposals of the Agenda in 2023. This information is part of the regulatory planning for the year, indicating the quarter expected to complete each stage of the regulation flow.

Anvisa includes "conflict resolution" as another tool for dialogue with users

On March 1st, the Rue No. 109/2023 came into force, which deals with conflict resolution between Anvisa and users of its services. Based on legal norms published by the Comptroller General of the Union (CGU), the Rule No. 109/2023 establishes the methodology and mechanisms that guide the conduct of conflict resolution in the administrative scope, in issues that involve complaints or administrative appeals imposed by the regulated/users. It is therefore a guiding tool for the implementation of Peaceful Conflict Resolution in Anvisa, through the Ombudsman's Office.

Consolidation of rules on additives and technological aids for use in food published

On March 8th, Anvisa published the consolidation of the rules for food additives and technological coadjutants authorized for use in food. The objective of this consolidation is to facilitate the identification of authorized substances, with their respective conditions of use, by both the regulated sector and regulatory authorities.

The requirements and lists of food additives and technological coadjutants authorized for use in food will now be included in two resolutions and one normative instruction: (i) Resolution of the Collegiate Board - RDC 778/2023; (ii) Normative Instruction 211/2023; (iii) Resolution of the Collegiate Board - RDC 779/2023.

Federal Court of Accounts

The Court conducts an audit of the main federal public policies on biofuels. Ruling 251/2023 - Plenary. TC 015.561/2021-6.

The Federal Court of Accounts (TCU) conducted an operational audit on the National Agency of Petroleum, Natural Gas and Biofuels (ANP), the Ministry of Mines and Energy (MME), the Ministry of Economy (ME), and the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Supply (MAPA) to verify if federal public policies for biofuels are achieving their intended objectives and if they are aligned with each other and with other cross-cutting initiatives. The inspection evaluated the three main federal public policies that drive the development and use of biofuels in the country: the National Program for Production and Use of Biodiesel (PNPB), and RenovaBio.

Agência Nacional de Saúde Suplementar (ANS)

ANS holds webinar on new prudential regulation

The National Supplementary Health Agency (ANS) will hold the New Prudential Regulation webinar on March 30. Dedicated to operators and their associations, healthcare service providers, investors, and government agencies interested in the topic, the event will be virtual. The webinar aims to address the changes introduced in regulatory capital with the publication of Normative Resolution No. 569/22, as well as to detail the simplifications in prudential regulation brought about by the issuance of Normative Resolution No. 573/23. Both resolutions significantly alter the economic-financial monitoring carried out by the Directorate of Standards and Operator Qualification (DIOPE) on the operators.

ANS adopts integrated ESG governance and social responsibility policy

On March 22, the Integrated ESG Governance and Social Responsibility Policy of the National Supplementary Health Agency (ANS) came into effect. The initiative promotes United Nations (UN) principles based on human and labor rights, environmental protection, and anti-corruption. The policy is aligned with the strategic planning, the 2023-2025 Regulatory Agenda, and the daily tasks of the Agency

ANS announces updates on the Brazilian Open Data Portal

On March 6th, ANS announced new functionalities on the Brazilian Open Data Portal. The Portal underwent a restructuring and now presents new features such as a dedicated area for creating discussion topics, a greater number of filters for searches, and the possibility for users to evaluate the dataset, suggest tags, suggest improvements or report any problems. Currently, ANS maintains 58 datasets on the Portal.

TELECOMMUNICATION

National Telecommunications Agency (Anatel)

Anatel discusses implementation of Tactical Plan

On March 17th, the National Telecommunications Agency (Anatel) held a workshop to discuss its priority initiatives based on the 2023-2027 Strategic Plan. The event discussed important topics such as promoting quality and transparency in the fixed broadband offer, improving the quality and capacity of infrastructure, and modernizing inspection mechanisms.

Anatel extends public consultation on strategic initiatives

On March 24th, Anatel announced the extension of the deadline for Public Consultation No. 4/2023 on strategic initiatives until 11:59 p.m. on March 26th. The public consultation aims to obtain inputs and perceptions from the sector to support the implementation of Anatel's two-year tactical plan for 2023-2024, developed from priority strategic initiatives of the 2023-2027 Strategic Plan. Contributions from stakeholders should be sent through the Participa Anatel system. With this initiative, the regulatory agency seeks to hear the opinions of various sectors of society to improve telecommunications services in Brazil.

Anatel convened public consultation on satellite exploration rights in the S-band frequency ranges

On March 23rd, Anatel announced the opening of Public Consultation No. 18/2023, which aims to receive comments from society regarding the intention to confer satellite exploration rights in the S-band frequency ranges. Contributions should be sent until May 7th, and the consultation will be open for 45 days.

The S-band is composed of frequency ranges from 1,980 MHz to 2,010 MHz (uplink) and from 2,170 MHz to 2,200 MHz (downlink), forming a 30 + 30 MHz arrangement. The proposal submitted to the public consultation aims to confer the right of satellite exploration.

The objective of the proposal is to promote broad and fair competition and access by different economic agents to the market, respecting the current regulatory framework. In addition, Anatel seeks comments from society regarding the feasibility of operating satellite systems with 15 + 15 MHz blocks or narrower bandwidths, and the possibility of segmenting a portion of the range for the development of specific applications, such as the Internet of Things (IoT).

National Agency of Petroleum, Natural Gas and Biofuels (ANP)

ANP proposes a single resolution for the process of bidding on areas for exploration and production of oil and gas

On March 2, the ANP Board of Directors approved a public hearing, preceded by a 45-day public consultation period. The aim is to gather feedback on a draft resolution that unifies bidding procedures for granting the right to explore, rehabilitate and produce oil and natural gas under concession and production-sharing regimes. The draft resolution includes the Permanent Offer system and bidding rounds, establishing unified procedures for concession and production-sharing regimes, which are currently regulated by ANP Resolutions No. 18/2015 and No. 24/2013, respectively.

CNPE approves resolution that reinstates the increase of biodiesel blending to 12% in diesel fuel

On March 17, the National Energy Policy Council (CNPE) approved a resolution that increased the blending of biodiesel in diesel fuel sold in Brazil to 12%, starting in April of this year. The proposal approved by the Council also provides for an increase to 13% (blend B13) in April 2024, 14% (blend B14) in April 2025, and 15% (blend B15) in April 2026.

Investment forecast in authorized movement infrastructure for 2022 exceeds R\$1 billion

ANP issued a bulletin stating that the investment forecast in authorized movement infrastructure for 2022 is approximately R\$1.15 billion, to be carried out throughout the construction period of the facilities that obtained authorizations. Of this amount, approximately R\$665 million will be invested in terminals, R\$126 million in oil pipelines, and R\$341 million in gas pipelines.

The Annual Bulletin aims to present the main authorizations, investments, and increments for 2022 related to Brazilian infrastructure for oil, derivatives, natural gas, and biofuels.

On April 7th, 2023, from 10am to 5pm, the workshop "Regulatory Challenges in Technological Societies: dialogue between the United States and Brazil" will be held. The event is organized by the coordinator of Regulation in Number, Péricles Gonçalves Filho, in partnership with FGV Direito, and aims to establish a dialogue between professors and State agents from Brazil and the United States to discuss some of the regulatory challenges faced in these two countries, with a special focus on risk regulation. ENERGY

National Electric Energy Agency (ANEEL)

ANEEL proposes a Sandbox Project for Research and Development initiative

The ANEEL, along with energy distributors in Brazil, presented a Research and Development (R&D) project on coordinating and governing tariff experiments in low-voltage energy users in the country on March 17th. The project aims to develop more appropriate electricity tariffs and gain a better understanding of consumer behavior. The sandboxes are temporary authorizations for agents to test tariff models based on different techniques and technologies, subject to criteria and limits established by the ANEEL. The initiative is expected to last for the next five years, with up to 21.3 thousand consumers participating and investments of up to R\$102.9 million.

Public Hearing on the revision of the Rural Universalization Plan of Energisa Rondônia

On March 16th, a Public Hearing promoted by ANEEL was held in Porto Velho (RO) to discuss the review of Energisa Rondônia's Rural Universalization Plan. An Agency proposal was presented to extend the deadline for customer service from 2022 to 2024.

ANEEL approved a public consultation to discuss the partial revision of the Annual Allowed Revenue (RAP) of concession contracts for electric power transmission projects

On March 21st, ANEEL approved the opening of a public consultation to discuss the partial revision of the Annual Allowed Revenue (RAP) for concession contracts for the transmission of electrical energy related to projects that were licensed with a revision date in July 2023. The Agency identified 58 licensed concessionaires whose revenues will undergo Revision in 2023.

WATER AND SANITATION

National Water and Basic Sanitation Agency (ANA)

Public consultation on the reference standard for the universalization of water and sewage services receives contributions until May 5th

On March 23rd, ANA published a notice regarding the start of Public Consultation No. 01/2023, aimed at collecting contributions for the elaboration of a reference standard on progressive targets for the universalization of public water supply and sewage services.

The standard aims to assist the process of expanding access to public water supply and sewage services, as well as guide the establishment of an evaluation system for the fulfillment of targets for the expansion and universalization of the coverage of these public services.

ANA addresses water resources management in Brazil at UN Global Compact Action Platform for Water and Oceans meeting

On March 6th, the President-Director of the National Water and Basic Sanitation Agency (ANA), Veronica Rios, represented the institution at the 1st meeting of the UN Global Compact Action Platform for Water and Oceans. She also presented the national panorama on water resources management and the strategies for 2023 and for the UN Water Conference 2023, which took place in New York, United States, from March 22nd to 24th.
